Thanks to your generosity we will be able to add more computers for the students than originally planned. With so many assessment tools now going on line we will now be able to get our state test results faster so that our faculty can plan more diligently and effectively to meet the needs of our students! We are doing the detailed planning now for the Technology and Art room upgrade, and at this point, to do the job right, we are targeting August 2016 for completion of the work.

Students of the Class of 2016 and I made lots of phone calls to express our gratitude. The response by the alumni was overwhelmingly positive. It was a real joy to hear their interaction with our students. Some of the kids decided it was a good idea to write thank you notes. They organized themselves and gave up their free time at recess and after school to write these cards.

We had a very fun, and successful, Catholic Schools Week. Monsignor Kevin Sullivan, the Director of Catholic Charities for the Archdiocese of New York, said Mass on First Friday and then accepted over 3,000 food items for the Feed Our Neighbors Campaign! Grade 7 brought in the most items and was awarded the First Annual "Souper" Bowl Trophy! What a hoot!

Registration has now begun! Through a concentrated and collaborative effort with a new enrollment team we now have 24 students applying to our Kindergarten... and that took 3 days! We plan on enrolling 30 students. Our goal is 30 children in each grade. This will take time and lots of help!

We have been invited to participate in the St. Patrick's Day Parade on McClean Ave. in Yonkers! Stay tuned! We'll keep a section for the alumni! Please come out and take a stroll with us!

Once again, THANK YOU! Your generosity is overwhelming. Some folks even gave twice!

## ALUMNI ACTIVITY

This is the first Newsletter of our second year, and thanks to all of you, we have had a great first year and are well positioned to provide even more meaningful support to the School in the years ahead.

## Capital Campaign Result:

The 2015 Capital Campaign ran from October 1, 2015 to December 15, 2015 (officially), and donations continued to come in until late January. While our initial target was to raise \$25,000 to enable the School to upgrade the technology platform in the Technology and Art Room, thanks to the extraordinary generosity of you Alumni and Alumnae, the Campaign raised more than double the original target. The additional funds will be used to upgrade the teachers' classroom workstations and tools, further strengthening the teaching/learning experience at St. John's.



### **The Campaign raised \$52,490 from 192 donors.**

Individual contributions ranged from \$10 up to \$5,000+, and every contribution is very much appreciated and will be well used for the benefit of the students. The Class of 1955 led the way with 20 donors, followed by the Class of 1960 with 13, and the Classes of 1949 with 10. Amongst our donors, Eileen T. Curran, Class of 1941, was our "earliest grad" contributor, while Richard Gonzalez, Jr., 2015, is our most recent donor graduate....a span of nearly 75 years! **Attached to the Newsletter is an "Honor Roll of Donors" listing all the financial contributors by level of giving.**

The Students, teachers and students, as well as the Alumni Association Steering Group, are very grateful for your extraordinary financial generosity, and also want to



acknowledge the obviously many prayers offered in support of the Campaign. We can see the Lord's hand in the results.

## DISTINGUISHED GRADUATE



*Each Newsletter, we will highlight a St. John's Kingsbridge graduate who has distinguished him/herself in their chosen field: clergy, business, public service, military, education etc. as a source of pride for the Alumni population and as an example of a successful St. John's grad's career for the current students.*

### **Brother Steve Schlitte, FMS--- Class of 1966** From a youngster playing slap-ball on Kimberly Place to a leading Catholic educator



The life of Brother Steve Schlitte, a Marist Brother, and now Principal of Mount St. Michael Academy, is a story of vocational and educational growth, devoted to preparing young men to take their place in the world as leaders.

The son of a New York City fireman, Steve lived on Terrace View Avenue and as young guy delighted in exploring the then open areas and neighborhood and especially playing that very economical and Bronx inspired game, slap-ball, or punch-ball as others called it. Later, he also became an avid swimmer and biker. Drawn to help others early in life, Steve was also a regular volunteer at Schervier Nursing Home up in Riverdale.

After graduating from St. John's School in 1966, Steve attended Cardinal Spellman High School and then Marist College in Poughkeepsie, where he majored in Spanish language and literature. He spent his college junior year abroad, living and studying in Spain at the University of Madrid. Brother Schlitte is fluent in Spanish.

Even before becoming a Religious brother, he was drawn to the education profession, beginning his career at Archbishop Molloy High School as a Spanish and Religion teacher. After three years at Malloy, he entered the Marist Brothers' Novitiate and made his vows in 1978, whereupon he was assigned to teach at Sacred Heart School in Highbridge, the Bronx. He remained there for 13 years and had his first experience as a Principal.

After serving successfully as Novice Director, where he trained young men to become Marist Brothers, Brother Steve served at a number of Catholic schools in New Jersey as Principal, where among other achievements he developed programs for gifted and



talented students, students with learning differences, and Medquest, a program for students interested in the medical profession.

Along the way, during this time of ever increasing educational responsibility and achievement, he earned a Master's degree from St. John's University in Bilingual/Bicultural Education and completed course work and a dissertation for a doctorate in Administration, Policy and Urban Education from Fordham University.

In 2009, Steve returned to the Bronx to become Principal of Mount Saint Michael Academy, one of the most prestigious high schools in the country. In supervising and guiding the academic life of this elite institution, he is responsible for 800 students, 54 teachers and 25 support staff on a 22 acre campus with numerous buildings-----a significant management responsibility to go with his educational challenges!

Steve comments, "I've had a great career in Catholic education and I truly believe it is because of the great experience I had at St. John's. I was prepared academically, received a great spiritual foundation, made wonderful friends, and had a lot of fun in the process. I hope I can give back to this generation of kids all I received from my own Catholic education."

He urges today's St. John's student to take advantage of the great opportunity they have to grow and to learn, and at the same time be thankful for the sacrifices and investments family and other people are making on their behalf.
